




The Photographer's Guide to the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park

The Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park is one of the largest parks in the world. Straddling the border between southern Botswana and South Africa, it is not a lush park like Kruger, but is arid with waterholes and dry riverbeds.



What makes this park so special is the unusual amount of wildlife and the relative ease that they can be seen especially during the dry season when they come into the waterholes to drink.

The famous black-maned lions, cheetahs, leopards, birds, beautiful landscapes and wildflowers are just a few of the numerous photographic opportunities you might have if you keep your eyes open.

These guide books are especially unique because they are written by photographers for photographers of all skill levels.

They cover all of the travel details that you would expect in an outstanding guide book but they go a step farther in giving photographic tips and lessons such as "Choosing which Subject to Focus on/stay with" or "Anticipating Animal Behavior" or "What to do with Disappointing Photos" or "Photographing Landscapes".

These are just a few of the lessons and they are good for any location whether it is an exotic Safari or your own backyard.
