
The Photographer's Guide to the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park

I have not had the privilege to visit the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park so when Mario requested that I review this book I grabbed the opportunity as I need to prepare and know what to expect when I take on this adventure.

The Photographer's Guide to the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park sheds light on all aspects required when planning your itinerary, booking your accommodation, ensuring that your equipment and luggage is adequate and appropriate. Furthermore, once in the Kgalagadi, your drives and outings you intend taking can be planned with relevant and helpful information; information on the best light, angles and distances to waterhole which will aid in setting up for the best possible photographs.

As a wildlife photographer, you should therefore be 'light' or 'situation' driven, and not 'subject-driven'. In other words you should be seeking out good light opportunities and then looking for a subject in those excellent lighting situations. If you find an exciting photo subject (like a leopard) at midday or hidden in bushes, the resulting photo will not be pleasing, but an ordinary subject, like a gemsbok in early morning or late afternoon light will make a very pleasing photograph.

The information provided in this book will help you to enjoy the experience rather than ending up in the wrong place or time, which could lead to disappointing photographs and a less pleasant trip. The content of the book covers every part of the park saving you endless time and agony finding the right places. It abridges a large portion of the time spent getting "The Shot", as copious time and research has gone into enabling the photographer to be ready at the "right time, right light, right places" of the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park.

Content and Structure

The 300 page book is structured and the layout easy to read. I read the book on my tablet so rest assured that you can take this book anywhere on mobile devices.

The objective of The Photographer's Guide to the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park is to provide photographers and tourists enough information to make the visit pleasant, practical and. for wildlife photographers, productive. The

structure, logic, layout and the flow is easy to read. More importantly, it is simple and practical to use as a reference before and during park visits.

The Photographer's Guide to the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park provides a guideline on how you should use the book as reference and provides visitors with good advice on equipment, clothing, tips and tricks.

NB: An interesting configuration with a simple solution for stacking equipment on a car seat, is a must read on pages 120 -122!

An additional bonus is that they have included 17 Photographic lessons throughout the book. I find these lessons very valuable and interesting. All the lessons can be applied in any park or situation so take notes and learn from the experiences shared.

The park is too large to expect to find sightings all day and driving from morning to night may leave you disappointed. The Photographer's Guide to the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park will provide you with the information you would require to make decisions on where to spend your time for optimal experiences and photography.

The book consists of plenty of detailed maps of the Kgalagadi (in greater detail than the standard park maps), including vantage points and indicators of the sun direction at the various times of day, thereby making this great for planning a trip. Using this information you can plan which camps to visit and spend more time at, following the guidance provided for daytime and night-time photography from the camps, at waterholes and along the roads in each area. Taking this book with you will prevent plenty of pain and wasted time on lessons learnt and the read is fun as the authors include some of their interesting experiences.

Supporting illustrations, maps and excellent photographs round off this information gem. The photos alone are worth the buy and read!
